2008 CoARC Excellence in Respiratory Care Education Award

CoARC presented its second annual *CoARC Award for Excellence in Respiratory Therapy Education* to Youngstown State University's Respiratory Care Program at a reception for educators held in conjunction with the 2008 American Association for Respiratory Care Summer Forum in Phoenix, Arizona (July 11-13). Graduates of the Ohiobased program earn a baccalaureate degree in respiratory care. The purpose of this award is to recognize outstanding programs that go beyond meeting the standards for accreditation.
