CoARC computes the CRT Credentialing Success as follows:
 Total number of credentialed graduates ÷ by the total number of graduates for a 3-year moving average.

For example: $5+17+2 \div$ by total number of grads for 2010+2009+2008.

Tentatively, for the 2011 Report of Current Status (RCS), that average would be for grad years 2010, 2009, 2008. The Commission has not made its final decision.

The NBRC report does NOT show total number of graduates, only the number of graduates who attempted the exam(s).
